GOOD NEWS FOR KENT ELMS JUNCTION

Cllr Rob McMullan reports: The Council has agreed to some changes to make the Kent Elms Junction safer. This is following pressure from local residents and Eastwood's Lib Dem Councillors. The "3 into 2" merge lanes, Southend bound, outside Essex Ford are being scrapped. The inside lane approaching the traffic lights from London will be made into a dedicated left turn lane into Rayleigh Road. Dave Poulton and myself have a commitment from the Highways Department to have all the road markings approaching the junction repainted. However, there is still more to do, and we are pushing for a dedicated green filter light for traffic turning right out of Rayleigh Road onto the A127 towards London.

Good News for Whitehouse Road. Flashing solar powered speed limit signs will be installed along the road to warn speeding drivers to slow down and will help cut the number of vehicles speeding along Whitehouse Road.

TORIES TO CUT FAMILY CENTRES? Dave Poulton writes:

Following a review of services across Southend, the Conservative administration have proposed a number of changes to the Family Centres with cuts of up £420,000 per year. These Centres provide vital support for pregnant women and families with children under five. They also deliver the Healthy Start programme and address issues such as food poverty and emotional well-being.

Eastwood's Family Centre, which operates out of Eastwood Primary School, is one of the Centres under review. I attended a Consultation meeting in January and had the opportunity to look at the scheme in greater detail, as well as ask questions. It is clear that following this meeting there are significant cuts planned to Family Centres across Southend and these cuts may affect Eastwood with support reduced or even withdrawn.



CONSERVATIVE PROPOSED BUDGET CUTS FOR 2024

Cllr Paul Collins writes "The Conservative administration's proposed Budget for 2024 has a line for Branch Library review with a reduction from five to three open Branch Libraries across the City. Kent Elms and Leigh Libraries were being looked at as becoming the only one Branch library open in the west of the City. Your **Councillors and campaigners made strong** representations to the Council Officers tasked with these Draft Budget proposals and made it clear that it would be a disaster to lose either one for our community. I am pleased to report that this proposal is now shelved for the moment. but it is still a threat for the future. Your Lib Dem Councillors will remain vigilant and watch future Budget proposals, just in case!"

Conservatives' U-Turn on rubbish collections

Last year, when in opposition, Southend's Tories promised to continue weekly rubbish collections and to keep the current bags. Now, they are in control of the Council, they have announced a complete U-Turn and will introduce fortnightly collections and move over to Wheelie Bins from next year. The Conservatives were so opposed to this in opposition that they forced a number of blocking votes at Council that delayed the process of choosing a new waste collection contractor after Veolia had given notice to guit the contract from October 2023.

The result in the delays meant that the Council had to pay out an extra £1.3

million a year of your money for a temporary extension to the current contract to ensure that waste collections continued until a new waste contractor is appointed.

Dave Poulton says "The Tories have let the residents of Southend down with their broken promises! Can you trust them?"

Now is the time for all Councillors to work together to ensure an affordable and efficient new waste contract is in place to minimise any disruption that this will cause to residents.
