JUNCTION SAFETY FOR EASTWOOD ROADS

Paul's campaign to make our most dangerous road junctions safer has been agreed by the Council and you will see notices put up around all these road junctions in the near future:

- ▶ ROACH VALE, BYFIELD & PARKWAY CLOSE all with GREEN LANE
- ▶ NOBLES GREEN ROAD with GREEN LANE
- ▶ DANDIES DRIVE with GREEN LANE
- ▶ WREN AVENUE with GREEN LANE
- ▶ SPRINGWATER ROAD with EASTWOOD RISE
- ▶ HUDSON ROAD with both LAMBETH ROAD and PINWOOD AVENUE

Paul says: "It's good that the Council agrees that these junctions need to be looked at to stop dangerous parking – and with Green Lane on the No 9 bus route, turning into and out of Green Lane needs to be made safer."
